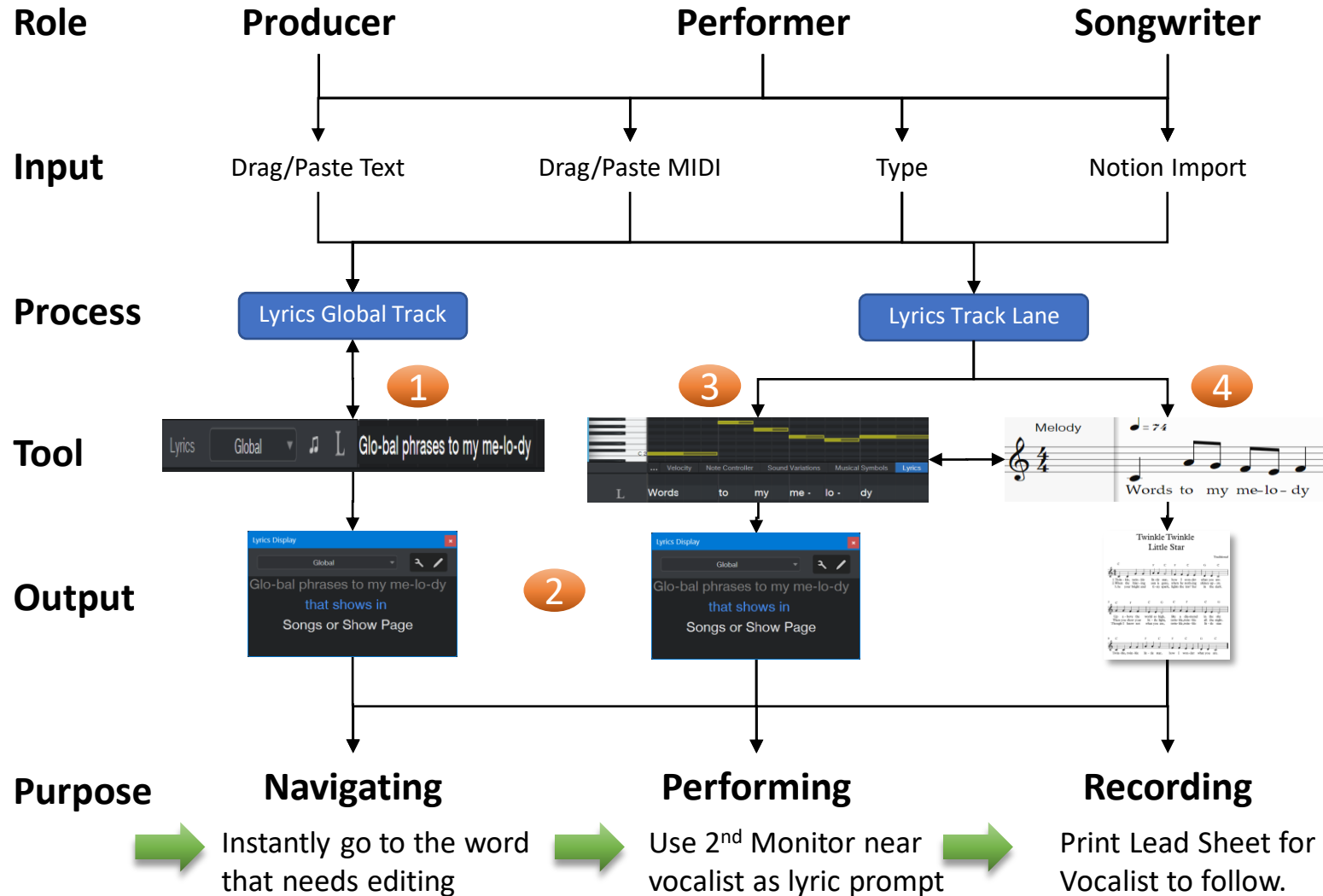


# Studio One 6 Lyrics Overview



- The *Global Lyrics Track* allows you to enter and edit Lyrics via a dedicated Track in the Song Page.**

  - Press [Spacebar] to advance to the next word.
  - Press [Return/Enter] to start a new line (visible in Lyrics Display ) and advance to the next bar.
  - Press [TAB] to advance to the next Lyrics entry point without starting a new line.
  - Press [Alt+Return/Enter] to align the currently-selected Lyric Event with the Play Cursor and select the next Lyric Event. This can be done during playback
- Lyrics Display* click the icon in the header of the Lyrics Track.**

  - [Arrow keys] to navigate the caret
  - [Shift + Arrow keys] to make a selection
  - [Option / Alt + left / right] to jump between words
  - Home to jump to the start of a line End to jump to the end of a line
  - Double-click to select a word Triple-click to select a line
  - [-] at the beginning of a syllable moves the syllable forward on the time grid by the selected grid value
  - When entering Lyrics, the [spacebar], [tab], or [-] (hyphen) will advance Lyrics entry to the next Grid point.
- Lyrics Lanes* are instrument-note specific and are accessed in the Lanes section of the Note Editor**

**Lyrics Lanes**

  - Double-click a Lyrics Event and begin typing your lyrics. Type naturally, just as using a word processor - the spacebar will jump your position from one Note Event to the next.
  - [spacebar] automatically moves the cursor to the next edit position.
  - [-] splits a word into syllables. (This dash will not render in the Lyrics Display window)
  - [ ] extends a word across multiple notes (melisma)
- To assign *Lyrics* to note values in the *Score View*, click the Lyr tool from the Symbols palette in the Note Editor Inspector.**

  - Click any note in the Score View to open a lyric entry field associated with the chosen note.
  - Pressing the spacebar or tab key will advance the entry field to the next note.
  - For multi-syllabic words that span several notes, use the dash (-) key in the middle of your lyric to advance to the next note and render a hyphen between the syllables.
